Physics will open up a whole new world you never noticed before. You will never walk down a street, ride in a car, or look in a mirror without involuntarily seeing an extra dimension. There are times when you will have to memorize what symbols mean – just like first grade. There will be times when you will confuse things that seem as much alike as  $b$ ,  $d$ , and  $p$  once did, until you suddenly see how different they are. This has happened to all of us. But then the moment of insight will come, and you will see whole new images fitting together.

We will be covering topics that meet California State Standards as well as those found within the Liberty Christian educational guidelines. Please seek help after school, before school, or during class to achieve your best. I do not ask for perfection here, but I do ask that you apply yourself to the best of your ability. It is important to be self-motivated and strong willed. God bless!

**Supplies:**

- Pencils (at least 2)
- Pens (red pen for grading)
- Paper (lined paper AND graph paper)
- Binders (three-ring binder with dividers for “notes”, “lab worksheets”, “quizzes”, “tests”)
- Notebook (70 pages; wide ruled is preferred)
- Lab Notebook (Composition notebook)
- Calculator (graphing calculator not required; I recommend the **TI-30X IIS** shown to the right; needs to have trigonometric functions)

**Grade Breakdown:**

**Homework Grading:**

Homework assignments will be given a 0, 1, or 2 based on the level of completion.

0 points – missing assignment, less than half done

1 point – more than half done, no work shown, late homework

2 points – all the work is done, work is shown

Format assignments with the following in the upper right hand corner:

- Name
- Date
- Period
- Assignment

Every problem must be numbered. Explain your reasoning on questions. Math problems must have work shown and **box your answer**. I highly recommend using pencil instead of pen because it will make your homework neater.

We will review the previous night's homework at the start of class. I will collect it then.

**Late homework** will be half credit after the first school day late. Then NO CREDIT after that.

**Absent work** will be collected by me. There will be a tray in the back where you can pick up your absent work. You will have the same number of days absent to do the make-up work.

**Extra Innings Wednesday:**

**Bellwork:**

Every day you will find an assignment on the board to do when you walk into class. Use a sheet of paper and format it like you would do for any homework assignment. This is part of your **PARTICIPATION GRADE**.

**Chapter Tests:**

These tests will cover every topic covered in the chapter. **You will only have the class period to finish the test**; no coming in during lunch or after school to finish.

It is closed book.

Absent – for tests. Please see me.

**In-class Assignments/Guided Practice:**

During class we will be doing a few problems together as guided practice. Format your paper in the same way as you would homework. We will work together on solving these problems. These problems will be very similar to ones found in the homework.

Occasionally, we will do some assignments only in-class and those will count towards the in-class assignment grade. Most likely these will be assignments given on Wednesday.

**Absent** students will not need to make-up guided practice assignments, but will need to do in-class assignments. Please see me to make those up.

**Project:**

More details on this project as we get closer. It will be due the week before finals.

**Quizzes:**

These quizzes will be announced so you can prepare for them. They will only cover the most recent topics. Unless you need a chart or graph, it is **closed books and notes**. They are timed for **15 minutes**.

**Class Binders:**

You must have a three ring binder that will include a five subject divider. Here is the list of topics for your dividers:

- NOTES
- LAB WORKSHEETS
- QUIZZES
- TESTS

I will collect these at the end of each quarter. All papers must be in order by the **DATE**.

**Retests:**

There will be no re-tests for any reason. I encourage you to study hard and smart. Please see me if you do not understand a particular topic.
